Programs and Description	<ul> <li>-Transitional housing for survivors of domestic violence and/or sexual violence, homeless women, and homeless pregnant teens</li> <li>-Serves women, men and teens age 13 or older in Andover, Boxford, Georgetown, Groveland, Haverhill, Lawrence, Methuen, Merrimack, North Andover and North Reading.</li> <li>-Single Residency Occupancy: permanent housing option for single women who have become homeless due to domestic and/or sexual violence (without children living with them)</li> <li>-Emergency Women's Shelter for women who have undergone domestic violence (contact at info@ywcalawrence.org for more information about shelter)</li> <li>-Youth Education about Healthy Relationships—in-school workshops on healthy relationships</li> <li>-Immigrant Advocacy—specialized services to recent immigrants who are victims of abuse</li> <li>-Legal Advocacy: two full-time, bi-lingual (English-Spanish) Court Advocates at the Lawrence District Court every day that court is in session and on-call at the Lawrence Probate Court.
